Range Setup: July 13, 2019 at 0700 hrs. **NO PRACTICE!**

Squadding & Firing Times: Squadding starts at 0700 hrs. On the 1000 yard line. Firing starts when ready.

Entries: Squadding will be made on SR-1 cards at the range on the day of firing. **ON LINE ENTRIES ONLY WILL BE ACCEPTED.** Entries will be accepted to the limit of the range. Fees: Individual Package price for both days: \$100.00. One day Saturday or Sunday only: \$55.00. Juniors with any NRA classification shoot for free - no awards.

Eligibility: Competitors must complete a MRPA-LR Release of Liability yearly. They must additionally be a member of the Michigan Rifle and Pistol Assn., their home state association, or pay a \$10 fee. NRA membership is not required. For MRPA memberships, see <http://www.michrpa.org>.

Pit Duty/ Pullers/ Other Duties: Electronic targets will be used; scoring duty will be required.

Rules: This is an NRA Registered match. Current NRA High Power Rifle Rules govern. All matches will be fired on the standard LR targets using Rule 5.6, prone position. The Match Director reserves the right to modify the course of fire and pit rotation based on number of competitors, weather, and range conditions.

Shooter Classification: The NRA Long Range classification system applies. Shooters must declare their Shooter Classification and Rifle division/class on each completed scorecard. Unclassified competitors compete in the Master Class or use their High Power classification. Rule 19.6 - Assigned Classification, or 19.2 - Temporary Classification apply.

Rifle Divisions: There will be two rifle divisions: LR Rifle and F-Class Rifle. Depending upon the number of entries, the LR division may include classes for Service Rifle--Rule 3.1, Palma Rifle--Rule 3.3.3, Match Rifle--Rule 3.2, 3.3.1, & 3.3.2, and Any Sight Rifle (AROS)--Rule 3.4. The F-Class division may include classes for F(O) and F(TR). Section 22 Rules applies.

Course of Fire Saturday: For Long Range Rifles: Iron sights.

Match 1 - Unlimited sighters and 20 shots for record prone in 30 minutes, slow-fire, 1000 yards.

Match 2 - Two sighters and 20 shots for record prone in 30 minutes, slow-fire, 1000 yards.

Match 3 - Two sighters and 20 shots for record prone in 30 minutes, slow-fire, 1000 yards.

Match 4 - Aggregate of Saturday Matches 1, 2, and 3.

Course of Fire Sunday: For Long Range Rifles: Any Rifle / Any Sight.

Match 5 - Unlimited sighters and 20 shots for record prone in 30 minutes, slow-fire, 1000 yards.

Match 6 - Unlimited sighters and 20 shots for record prone in 30 minutes, slow-fire, 1000 yards.

Match 7 - Aggregate of Sunday Matches 5-7

Match 8 - Aggregate of Scores from Matches 4 & 7.

Categories, Classes, and Awards Disposition: There must be 5 or more entries in a rifle class/ shooter classification for one award or 10 or more for two awards, etc. If there are fewer than 5 High Masters entered, they will fire for open awards only. The High Master Class and the AROS class will not be combined with any other class. **MICHIGAN STATE LONG RANGE CHAMPIONS:** The Match 9 winners for LR Rifle, F(O) Rifle, and F(TR) Rifle will be declared the **2019** Michigan State Long Range Champions. Only Michigan residents may be declared Michigan State Champions.
